

<u>Defining 'Bullying' at Biscovey</u> Aspire Academy Trust Anti-Bullying Policy

It is important that as a school community we are clear on what constitutes bullying and what doesn't. As a school we have a 'zero tolerance' approach to bullying and during our assembly this week, we re-shared with the children our school and trusts definition of bullying and unpicked the difference between a 'fall-out' and 'bullying'. I wanted to re-share with our parents and carers so as we are all consistent and have that shared understanding.

3.2. What is Bullying?

- **3.2.1.** Bullying is defined by the DfE as "behaviour by an individual or group, repeated over time, that intentionally hurts another individual or group either physically or emotionally" (Preventing & Tackling Bullying DfE 2017).
- **3.2.2.** Bullying can take many forms including persistent name-calling, violence, threatened violence, isolation, ridicule or indirect action such as spreading unpleasant stories about someone. It often



3.2.3.	Our Trust definition of bullying, in "child-speak", is "when a person or group deliberately and repeatedly hurts you physically, or hurts your feelings, making you feel sad or scared."
3.2.4.	Our schools work hard to ensure that all pupils know the difference between bullying and the "falling out" that occurs between children and within friendships.
3.2.5.	We take into account that child development research suggests that young children do not have the cognitive capability to be intentionally cruel, or to abuse a power differential. Bullying involves planning and complex thought. The ability to discern right from wrong (and how to systematically humiliate a peer) generally does not develop until the age of six or so.

Reels, stories and snaps explained

These are some of the features of different social media platforms and what they mean:

- **Reels:** are short videos that users can create, edit and upload to share with their followers.
- Stories: a way of posting photo and video content that typically vanishes after 24 hours. However, they can also be saved to a profile and viewed again.
- **Snaps:** a snap is a picture or video which is deleted automatically once it has been viewed. They can be viewed for only a few seconds before deleting.
- DMs: direct message, used to describe private messages send on social media.



Why do children use social media?


Children and young people use many different social media apps and sites. The most popular are Facebook and Instagram, with many others such as Snapchat, TikTok and Twitter.

There are lots of benefits to social networking. They can allow users to stay connected with friends and family. They can also learn many different things, from make-up or gaming tutorials to making slime, or how to create their own videos.

Like most things, there can be negatives too. For children and young people there are risks that you should be aware of, to help keep your child safe on social media.

When children are struggling, social joy provides a release of 'feel-good' chemicals such as oxytocin and opioids, these chemicals are anti-anxiety and anti-anger, helping children to feel well again in themselves and the world. Through our PACE (playful, accepting, curious and empathic) approach we use play in many different ways across the school but know that social joy can only be brought about when play is experienced with an emotionally available adult. Children are required by law to attend school 190 days per year. The Government states that every pupil's attendance should be at least 95%.

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
